

Mammography

What is mammography?

Mammography is the process of using low energy x-rays to examine the human breast which is used as a diagnostic and screening tool. The goal of mammography is the early detection of breast cancer, typically through detection of characteristic masses and/or microcalcifications.

What to expect

At BRMC, patients are scheduled every 20 minutes. Bradford uses GE digital equipment with flex paddles which absorb pressure to the breast while still getting the best image possible to accommodate a patient's comfort. The mammography room has changing booths that are secluded from the rest of the department for patient privacy. Preparation for this exam requires patients to avoid using deodorant and refrain from caffeine after midnight. For more information contact Imaging Services at 814/362-8200.
